

Should You Change Your Oil Every 3,000 Miles?



The Answer is, it Depends...

There's been a lot of talk (***even on T.V. & the internet***) about how often you should change your oil. Many new cars today are recommending that the oil does not need to be changed every 3,000 miles as it had in the past. This change began to occur gradually a few years ago.

It is true that most manufacturers are **now recommending longer oil change intervals** than what used to be the standard 3,000 miles.

One reason for that is that these **vehicles now come with synthetic or semi-synthetic oils**.

It's not the same for everybody BECAUSE many factors come into consideration.

While it is true that these vehicles can go longer IF recommended by the manufacturer it is **very important** that when the oil change is done if there is synthetic or semi-synthetic oil in them you should **replace that oil with a synthetic or semi-synthetic oil**.

Be sure to know that we at **Your Auto Center** will **always replace** the oil in your vehicle with the **type of oil the manufacturer recommends**. This is not always true of every repair facility, **which could result in your warranty being voided**.

If you change your own oil, heed this advice, replace the oil you take out with what the manufacturer recommends, or **you may void your warranty** not to mention that you could **end up with a major repair**.

If you have an older vehicle the same advice applies. If when your vehicle was manufactured, they **recommended you change your oil every 3,000 miles** you should **continue** to do so.
